Reflection from Fr Renato for the Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross

The Exaltation of the Cross -"God's victory over death and sin and the gift of divine life."

The Cross is one of the most central objects of the Christian faith. It is the symbol of God's love for us, expressed through the self-sacrificing death of Jesus, His Incarnate Son.

"Today, the cruelty of the Cross is not what is exalted, but the Love that God manifested to humanity by accepting death on the Cross: 'Who, though in the form of God, emptied himself, taking the form of a slave. This is the glory of the Cross of Jesus!" (Pope Francis). And in today's Gospel of John, we read: "...God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." (John 3:17).

The Cross is the power of God to raise His Son from death to new life as His Resurrected Son. The "lifting up" takes place upon the Cross, the instrument of Christ's return to the Father and His ascent into heaven.

Those who approach the Cross in faith, who "look upon it" in this sense, as the Israelites looked upon the figure of the bronze serpent in today's reading from the Book of Numbers, will receive what the Israelites received: rescue from death and the gift of life. As it was challenging for the Israelites to confront the serpent —the instrument of their affliction—so it is challenging for believers to confront the Cross, which, at one level, was the instrument of a terrible execution. But those who "look upon it" with faith confront, at the same time, both their own sinfulness and the victory over that sinfulness that the Cross represents.

Beyond the terrible execution, Christ dying upon the Cross becomes transparent to the extremity of divine love that brought Him there to rescue and give life to human beings. Hence, the Cross is a highly esteemed symbol for Christians everywhere and a way by which they express their faith. We place a Cross in our churches and homes, in the classrooms of our schools, and in other Christian institutions. Many wear a Cross as part of their dress.

Jesus on the Cross—when we experience our own pain and suffering, Jesus gives us strength, knowing that He who emptied Himself to become one with us and for us calls us to give our suffering to Him in love. In His humanity and in our humanity, we are one and share in His divine life.

We remember Jesus' words to His followers: "...whoever does not take up the cross and follow me is not worthy of me. Those who find their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake will find it." (Matthew 10:38–39).

As we often sing after the Consecration during the Eucharist: *Dying, you* destroyed our death; rising, you restored our life. Amen.

Everything is a reminder of the Cross. We ourselves are made in the shape of a cross.

SCRIPTURE READINGS - YEAR C

Feast: Exaltation of the Holy Cross



Collect:

O God, who willed that our Only Begotten Son should undergo the Cross to save the human race, grant, we pray, that we, who have known his mystery on earth, may merit the grace of his redemption in heaven. Amen.

First Reading: Numbers 21: 4-9

In those days: the people became impatient on the way. They spoke against God and against Moses, "Why have you brought us up out of Egypt to die in the wilderness? For there is no food and no water, and we detest this miserable food." Then the Lord sent poisonous serpents among the people, and they bit the people, so that many children of Israel died. The people came to Moses and said, "We have sinned by speaking against the Lord and against you; pray to the Lord to take away the serpents from us. So Moses prayed for the people. And the Lord said to Moses, "Make a poisonous serpent, and set it on a pole; everyone who is bitten shall look at it and live." So Moses made a serpent of bronze, and put it upon a pole; and whenever a serpent bit someone, that person would look at the serpent of bronze and live.

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 30 (31): 2-6, 15-16, 20

R: Do not forget the works of the Lord!

Give ear, 0 my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth. I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old. R.

When God killed them, the people sought for him; they repented and sought him earnestly. They remembered that God was their rock, the Most High God their redeemer. R.

But they flattered him with their mouths; they lied to him with their tongues. Their heart was not steadfast toward him; they were not true to his covenant. R.

Yet he, being compassionate, forgave their iniquity, often he restrained his anger, and did not stir up all his wrath. R.

Second Reading: Philippians 2: 6-11

Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, he did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death- even death on a cross. Therefore God highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! We adore you, O Christ, and we praise you, because by your cross you have redeemed the world.

Gospel: John 3: 13-17
Jesus said to Nicodemus: "No one has ascended into heaven except the one who descended from heaven, the Son of Man And just as Moses lifted up the serpent in the wilderness, so must the Son of Man be lifted up, that whoever believes in him may have eternal life. For God so loved the world that he gave his only-begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

Prayer After Communion:

Having been nourished by your holy banquet, we beseech you, Lord Jesus Christ, to bring those you have redeemed by the wood of your life-giving Cross to the glory of the resurrection. Amen.
