Reflection from Fr Cao for the 28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

St Luke in today's Gospel tells us a story about ten lepers crying out: 'Jesus! Master! Take pity on us!' Jesus commanded them to go and show themselves to the priests who would verify their healing. They then were to offer appropriate sacrifices. Both actions would provide them with re-entry into the life of the broader society, their families and loved ones. They simply went, did what Jesus had told them and were physically healed. But one of them - only one, and that person a Samaritan turned back, rushing to throw himself down at the feet of Jesus to thank him. Only one. Jesus noticed and asked, 'Were not all ten made clean? The other nine, where are they?'.

This question echoes in our hearts today through the centuries and lands. Where are the other nine? Why did they not return? Perhaps they were too eager to get back to their lives, to their families, and the temple? Perhaps they took the healing for granted. But the Samaritan – the outsider, the foreigner like Naaman in the First Reading, the one least expected to return - came back, praising God and falling at Jesus' feet in gratitude. When was the last time we expressed our gratitude to God? Gratitude to God is an expression of our faith in His saving power.

In the face of the Samaritan's gratitude, Jesus says to him, 'Your faith has saved you.' The Samaritan received more than a mere physical healing. There was also salvation and wholeness involved. The nine were healed in body, but the one who returned in gratitude was healed in soul. This brings us to the heart of today's message: Gratitude is not just good manners, it is also the doorway to deeper relationship with God and to deeper faith When we recognise the gifts we have received and return to the Giver with thanksgiving, we are drawn into a more intimate relationship with God. Gratitude opens our eyes to grace and transforms healing into holiness.

Our problem is when we receive something on a regular basic, we tend to take this for granted, especially if it is a free gift. For some people, the regular receiving eventually turns into expectation. If we receive a gift long enough, we come to view it almost as an entitlement. We feel hurt, even anger, if we don't receive it any longer. In the same way, God gives us blessings every day. I don't deserve my comfortable home that I live in, the beautiful scenery around me, the clean water I drink, but after receiving these gifts and a multitude of others for years, I sometimes fail to be grateful. I've come to expect these good things. When one of them is removed for a short time, like water or electricity or internet going down, I get upset.

We receive the Sacrament of the Holy Eucharist every day. It is a sacrament of gratitude, of thanksgiving to God. It is one whole sacrifice through which we, the Church give thanks to God when we gather as one big and united family in his presence. As we come to celebrate daily and Sunday Eucharist, let us ask for the grace to be like the Samaritan and Naaman, to never take God's mercy for granted, and to always recognise God's hand in our lives. May our gratitude lead us to deeper faith, greater love, and a life that glorifies God. Amen.
