REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF Trinity Sunday

The Hebrew Bible is slightly different to the Christian Old Testament, in that it is shorter and has some of the Books in a slightly different order. God in the Hebrew Bible starts as a God of action. Action then leads to speech – God becomes a god of words. Speech yields in its turn to silence. In fact, in the 10 closing books of the Hebrew Bible, God says hardly a word. What conclusion can we draw from this? Let's use the famous story of St Thomas Aguinas.

Thomas was walking along the beach one day contemplating the Trinity. He stumbled across a boy running back and forth from the ocean with buckets of water that he was emptying into a hole he had dug. When asked to explain the boy answered: "I'm emptying the ocean into this hole." St Thomas chuckled and offered the boy his wisdom: "You'll never empty the ocean into the hole. The sea is so vast and your hole so small." But with uncanny confidence the boy replied: "Fr Thomas, I have as much chance of doing this as you have of explaining the vast mystery of the Holy Trinity!"



The point is that the mystery of God develops from action, through to words, and eventually into silence. We will never fully grasp the mystery of God in the Trinity – but this does not make the effort of filling the hole, or stumbling over words, or even sitting in silence unworthy. No, the effort can bring us into true intimacy with the deeper mystery and heart of this wonderful God who created us so that we can come to know, even a fraction of who God is and how much God loves us!

FIRST READING: Exodus 34: 4-6, 8-9

Moses rose early in the morning and went up on Mount Sinai, as the Lord had commanded him, and took in his hand the two tablets of stone.

The Lord descended in the cloud and stood with him there, and proclaimed the name, "The Lord." The Lord passed before Moses, and proclaimed, "The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness."

And Moses quickly bowed his head toward the earth, and worshipped. He said, "If now I have found favour in your sight, O Lord, I pray, let the Lord go with us. Although this is a self-necked people, pardon our iniquity and our sin, and take us for your inheritance."
