Reflection from Sr Carlene for the Feast of The Baptism of the Lord: Year A

- EMMANUEL: GOD-IS-WITH-US -

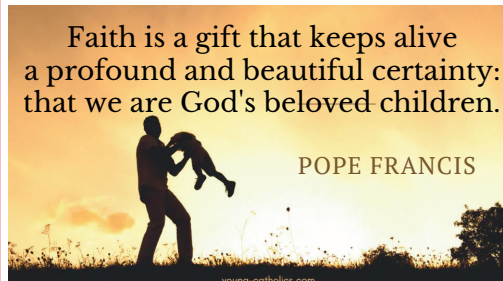
Today's Feast of the Baptism of the Lord doubles up as the last celebration of the Christmas Season and the First Sunday of Ordinary Time. It directs our focus to Jesus who "came from Galilee to the Jordan to be baptised by John" (Matt 3:13) and revealed as God's beloved Son and envoy (Matt 3: 17).

John's baptism is a baptism of repentance from sin. Jesus, who is sinless, submits to this baptism, reminding us that He was one of us and beginning his mission of proclaiming and establishing the reign of God in word and action.

Thus, as we reflect on Jesus' baptism, let us remember our own mission here on earth - to know, love, and serve God. Let us also keep in mind that we, too, are "beloved" sons and daughters of God, and that "God-is-with-us" every step of life's journey.

The Baptism of the Lord Year A helps us reflect on Jesus' mission and our own call to live as God's children. Spend time reading the Scripture passages and think about what they mean in your life.

*How does Jesus' example of humility and service inspire you?
Consider your own baptism and the ways you can share God's love with others.*
