Reflection from Sr Carlene for the

Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time:

THEME: HUMAN-KIND

As many of us know, in the Liturgy of the Word (the first part of Mass) the Responsorial Psalm forms a kind of <u>bridge</u> between the First Reading and the Gospel. Hence, today's <u>First Reading</u> is the second creation story (Gen 2:18-24) which focuses on the coming-to-be of man and woman. It is followed by <u>Psalm 127/128</u> which extolls family life, and then we have the <u>Gospel</u> (Mk 10: 2-16) which is Jesus' reflection on marriage, and on identification as children.

<u>A Few Thoughts About Today's Psalm:</u>

Firstly, it may be useful to refer to the Book of Psalms. There we find a collection of hymns (110–133) called Pilgrimage Psalms or Songs of Ascent. Most of these psalms were composed during or after the Exile, and, in all likelihood, they were used by the Jews as liturgical chants during their annual pilgrimage to Jerusalem. They were prayers from the heart expressing joy and trust in God and sung by the worshipping groups.

In today's Liturgy of the Word we have one of these Pilgrimage Psalms... Ps 127/128... which in contemporary times be often used in Christian weddings. Recounted from the male perspective, it describes the Godfearing man supporting his family, having healthy children, and being blessed with happiness, peace, prosperity, and grandchildren.

What meaning do we girls and women, boys and men glean from this psalm today? How does it apply to our lives?

Upon reflection, we may deduce that if we live life according to God's plan, striving to "fear the Lord and walk in his ways" (Ps 127/128), we will be blessed in this life and the life to come. Blessings will also ripple through our families, communities, societies and nations... so let it begin with me!!

A Final Comment:

The <u>Response</u> to Ps 127/128 is "<u>May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives."</u> It has been adapted from lines in the third stanza. Broad in scope and more inclusive of all people at all times, it is a wonderful little prayer or mantra which we can weave into our minds and hearts as we go about our daily chores.

LET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD

Collect:

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Almighty ever-living God, who in the abundance of your kindness surpass the merits and the desires of those who entreat you, pour out your mercy upon us to pardon what conscience dreads and to give what prayer does not dare to ask. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, for ever and ever. Amen.

First Reading: Genesis 2: 18-24

The Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life, and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it.

Then the Lord God said, "It is not good that the man should be alone; I will make him a helper as his partner."

So out of the ground the Lord God formed every animal of the field and every bird of the air, and brought them to the man to see what he would call them; and whatever the man called every living creatures, that was its name.

The man gave names to all cattle, and to the birds of the air, and to every animal of the field; but for the man there was not found a helper as his partner.

So the Lord God caused a deep sleep to fall upon the man, and he slept; then he took one of his ribs and closed up its place with flesh. And the rib that the Lord God had taken from the man he made into a woman and brought her to the man.

Then the man said, "This at last is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called Woman, for out of Man this one was taken."

Therefore a man leaves his father and his mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh.

Responsorial psalm : Ps 127: R.v.5

R: May the Lord bless us all the days of our lives.

Blessed is everyone who fears the Lord, who walks in his ways.

You shall eat the fruit of the labour of your hands; you shall be happy, and it shall go well with you. R.

Your wife will be like a fruitful vine within your house; your children will be like olive shoots around your table. R.

Thus shall the man be blessed who fears the Lord. The Lord bless you from Zion. May you see the prosperity of Jerusalem all the days of your life. R.

Second Reading: Hebrews 2: 9-11 We do indeed see Jesus, who for a little while was made lower than the Angels, now crowned with glory and honour because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

It was fitting that God, for whom and through whom all things exist, in bringing many sons and daughters to glory should make the pioneer of their salvation perfect through sufferings.

For the one who sanctifies and those who are sanctified are all from one. For this reason he is not ashamed to call them brothers and sisters.

Gospel Acclamation: Alleluia, alleluia!

If we love one another, God will live in us in perfect love. Alleluia!

Gospel: Mark 10: 2-16

Some Pharisees came, and to test Jesus they asked, "Is it lawful for a man to divorce his wife? Jesus answered them, "What did Moses command you?" They said, "Moses allowed a man to write a certificate of dismissal and to divorce her."

But Jesus said to them, "Because of your hardness of heart he wrote this commandment for you. But from the beginning of creation, 'God made them male and female.' 'For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh.' So they are no longer two, but one flesh.

Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Then in the house the disciples asked him again about this matter.

Jesus said to them, "Whoever divorces his wife and marries another commits adultery against her; and if she divorces her husband and marries another, she commits adultery.

People were bringing little children to him in order that Jesus might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, "Let the little children come to me; do not stop them: for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs.

Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it."

And Jesus took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

Prayer After Communion:

Grant us, almighty God, that we may be refreshed and nourished by the Sacrament which we have received, so as to be transformed into what we consume. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

In Alison's presentation, we were reminded of our role as Church to be vessels of and advocates of God's mission.

A PPC is important to help the parish continue to develop, to nourish our faith community, and reach out to others. PPC's are the functional structure of Catholic communities; they are supportive, visioning, advisory, consultative and planning bodies to help articulate God's mission. This requires careful listening and dialogue to understand and attend to the needs of the parish.

We were then given a workshop on 'project management'. Alison shared practical tools to assist us 'project with project management and planning.


Overall, it was a great day of learning something new or in a different light, and to discern where and how God is calling us to serve in the parish.
