Reflection from Fr Cao for the

Third Sunday of Advent in Year A 'Gaudete Sunday'

Today is Gaudete Sunday, Sunday of Joy. Continuing the themes of Hope and Peace in the last two weeks, the Church now asks us to be aware of the joy of the coming of Christ we commemorate at Christmas.

Isaiah exults us to "rejoice with joy and singing" because God is coming to save us. Being a generous God, our God will come with many gifts. "Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, the lame shall leap like a deer, the tongue of the mute sing for joy. The ransomed of the Lord shall return".

In today's gospel, Jesus' work and actions were so unique that they elicited a joyful response from the people. He fulfilled the prophecy of Isaiah to the extent that even John the Baptist heard of him from his prison. If we sincerely receive Christ into our lives when he comes, he shall fulfill our expectations by making us see again, walk again in righteousness, and hear and pay attention to his words.

However, because of being in prison for some-time, John the Baptist doubted: "Are you the one who is to come or are we to wait for another?" Maybe his singular vision, commitment, and determination have blinded him. Maybe his vision has become narrow and myopic. After all, wrath and fire are a far cry from the blind who receive sight, the lame who walk, the lepers who are cleansed, the deaf who hear, the dead who are raised, and the poor who are given good news. Maybe John's focus on wrath and fire has blurred his vision to everything else that is going on around him.

Like John the Baptist, we may have doubts in daily life, as our agenda and priorities often make us blind, deaf, crippled and mute. Sometimes we put on blinkers and sometimes our focus becomes our own blindness. Either way it leaves us in prison; incarcerated by our inability or unwillingness to see more, to explore other possibilities, to consider something new, different, or totally unexpected. Things that blind us can range from the ecstatic and joyful to the tragic and painful.

What can we do when we are in doubt? St James in the Second Reading urges us: "Be patient . . . until the coming of the Lord. . . Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near." In our journey of hope during this Advent, patience is a crucial word. These two gifts, patience and hope, work together to produce the joy which keeps us moving.

In 2013, Pope Francis said: "The joy of the gospel fills the hearts and the lives of all who encounter Jesus...With Christ, joy is constantly born anew." That joy comes from living in His presence now, not just in the future. He reminded us that we are called to be missionaries of Jesus, missionaries of joy, the joy we have received from encountering Christ. We carry Jesus to others because we have been touched by him. We have been transformed in Christ whose love accompanies us in all we do - acting with love, compassion and hope. This will bring us joy.

First Reading: Isaiah 35: 1-6, 10

The wilderness and the dry land shall be glad, the desert shall rejoice and blossom; like the crocus it shall blossom abundantly, and rejoice with joy and singing. The glory of Lebanon shall be given to it, the majesty of Carmel and Sharon. They shall see the glory of the Lord, the majesty of our God. Strengthen the weak hands, and make firm the feeble knees. Say to those who are of a fearful heart, strong, do not fear! Here is your God. He will come with vengeance, with terrible recompense. He will come and save you." Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, and the ears of the deaf unstopped; then the lame shall leap like a deer, and the tongue of the mute sing for joy. And the ransomed of the Lord shall return, and come to Zion with singing; everlasting joy shall be upon their heads; they shall obtain joy and gladness, and sorrow and sighing shall flee away.

Gospel: Matthew 11: 2-11

When John the Baptist heard in prison about the deeds of the Christ, he sent word by his disciples who said to Jesus, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. And blessed is anyone who takes no offence at me." As they went away, Jesus began to speak to the crowds about John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to look at? A reed shaken by the wind? What then did you go out to see? Someone dressed in soft robes? Look, those who wear soft robes are in royal palaces. What then did you go out to see? A Prophet? Yes, I tell you, and more than a Prophet. This is the one about whom it is written, "See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way before you." Truly I tell you, among those born of women no one has arisen greater than John the Baptist; yet the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he."
