# Reflection from the Parish Priest for the

**Fifth Sunday of Lent**We are approaching Holy Week, the celebration of Christ's mystery, death and resurrection which opens us to the fullness of life. The word of God challenges each one of us to recognise how different a vision of life we must have if we are to serve and follow Jesus Christ. "Anyone who loves his life, loses it, anyone who hates his life in this world will keep it for eternal life."

Jesus knows the time is coming. He knows it won't be fun, but it is necessary. He knows this is the purpose. "Unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." He has to suffer, to die, and to be resurrected. There has to be a Palm Sunday and Good Friday for there to be an Easter.

Many people go into hospital wondering about their illness and suffering, and thinking that death might be close. That's part of life. For Jesus, this time in his life is also a fearful time; it is confusing, and faith-testing. In a hospital, we can transform our pain into suffering, and find some great graces in it. We can be challenged to find new life. Pain becomes suffering. In Gethsemane, Jesus doesn't want the chalice of suffering, but he allows it to become fully part of him so that his inner strength is big! Jesus doesn't take a simple approach. Instead, his approach is acceptance of darkness in life.

On the cross Jesus is draws all people to himself. Jesus invites a faith response to God' love which he has manifested. The death of Jesus is like a seed falling into the ground where it perishes, but out of it, comes growth and a rich harvest. This is the way of love and all who follow Jesus must walk this path. By doing so, they participate in God's ultimate victory over evil.

Jesus reveals to us that God is not a distant figure from the past, but the living One who has suffered for us and now is calling us to new life. In him, we are offered nothing less than intimate friendship with God and faith in Him. Jesus also calls us to have the courage involves dying to our own pride. Every act of courage involves dying to our cowardice. Every act of courage involves dying to our selfishness. Our false self dies, and our true self, the one made in God's image, is born to a new and eternal

God's glory is in the living, suffering, and dying of Jesus, but that's not the end of the story. God's glory is in the raising of Jesus to new life, the final triumph of love over death.

# Collect:

By your help, we beseech you, Lord our God, may we walk eagerly in that same charity with which, out of love for the world, your Son handed himself over to death. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

# First Reading: Jeremiah 31: 31-34

The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. It will not be like the covenant that I made with their fathers when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt - a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

# Responsorial psalm: Ps 50: 3-4, 12-15. Rv.12 R: Create a clean heart in me, 0 God.

- 1. Have mercy on me, O God, according to your steadfast love; according to your abundant mercy blot out my transgressions. Wash me thoroughly from my iniquity, and cleanse me from my sin. R.
- 2. Create in me a clean heart, O God, and put a new and right spirit within me. Do not cast me away from your presence, and do not take your holy spirit from me. R.

# Second Reading: Hebrews 5: 7-9

In the days of his flesh, Jesus offered up prayers and supplications, with loud cries and tears, to the one who was able to save him from death, and he was heard because of his reverent submission. Although he was a Son, he learned obedience through what he suffered; and having been made perfect, he became the source of eternal salvation for all who obey him.

# Gospel: John 12: 20-30

Among those who went up to worship at the festival were some Greeks. They came to Philip, who was from Bethsaida in Galilee, and said to him, "Sir, we wish to see Jesus." Philip went and told Andrew, then Andrew and Philip went and told Jesus. Jesus answered them, "The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified. Very truly, I tell you, unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies, it remains just a single grain; but if it dies, it bears much fruit. The person who loves their life loses it, and the person who hates their life in this world will keep it for eternal life.

"Whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also. Whoever serves me, the Father will honour.

"Now my soul is troubled. And what should I say -'Father, save me from this hour?' No. It is for this reason that I have come to this hour. Father, glorify your name."

Then a voice came from heaven, "I have glorified it, and I will glorify it again."

The crowd standing there heard it and said that it was thunder. Others said, "An Angel has spoken to him." Jesus answered, "This voice has come for your sake, not for mine. Now is the judgment of this world; now the ruler of this world will be driven out. And I, when I am lifted up from the earth, will draw all people to myself."

Jesus said this to indicate the kind of death he was to die.
