Reflection from Sr Carlene for the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

LUKE 16: 19-31 AWARENESS OF OTHERS' NEEDS and OUR CALL TO RESPOND ~

In today's readings we have a parable pointing out the damning effects of wealth. Found only in the Gospel of Luke [16:19-31], it probably had a specific meaning for the early Christian community. Nevertheless, in our own present-day society of "haves" and "have nots" where the rich become richer and the poor becomes poorer, it still has a clear message for each one of us.

Luke succinctly sets the scene: Jesus is addressing the Pharisees (v19). We note that the <u>rich</u> man is unnamed: he is <u>defined</u> by his position and possessions. The poor man, however, is the only person ever named in Jesus' parables... a detail that "rings bells" for the Lucan audience and readers became <u>naming a person</u> acknowledges their unique identity and emphasises the teaching inherent in the parable.

Right from the start, today's Gospel vividly unfolds as stark contrasts emerge. We hear about the rich man enmeshed in his own world of finery and feasting. We then learn that the poor man <u>Lazarus</u> (whose name means <u>"God will help"</u>) is covered with sores. He is hungry, <u>unattended</u>, and left to beg <u>outside</u> the very gates of the estate.

Both men die and their fortunes are completely reversed. Lazarus is honoured with a place of glory alongside Abraham but the rich man is tormented by suffering in hell. Ironically, the rich man, who had been totally self-centred and stingy in life, now wants to help his siblings avoid a similar agonising fate. Abraham refuses this request and explains that people ignoring the wisdom and warnings of Moses and the prophets "will not be convinced over if someone should rise from the dead" (v31).

In essence, the parable of the rich man and Lazarus challenges us to review our focus and ask ourselves:

- Do we <u>value</u> wealth over love of God and neighbour?
- Do we have eyes, ears, and hearts that recognise and respond to the needs
- How do we react and <u>respond</u> to those who prick our consciences and refuse to let us off the hook?

Called to be disciples of Christ, let us be more attentive in prayer and action to opportunities around us to live out a sense of "connectedness" with all humans and with all of creation.

Collect:

God, who manifest your almighty power above all by pardoning and showing mercy, bestow, we pray, your grace abundantly upon us and make those hastening to attain your promises heirs to the treasures of heaven. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

First Reading: Amos 6: 1, 4-7
Thus says the Lord, the God of hosts: "Alas for those who are at ease in Zion, and for those who feel secure on Mount Samaria! Alas for those who lie on beds of ivory, and lounge on their couches, and eat lambs from the flock, and calves from the stall; who sing idle songs to the sound of the harp, and like David improvise on instruments of music; who drink wine from bowls, and anoint themselves with the finest oils, but are not grieved over the ruin of Joseph! Therefore they shall now be the first to go into exile, and the revelry of those who lie in ease shall pass away."

In the presence of God, who gives life to all things, and of Christ Jesus, who in his testimony before Pontius Pilate made the good confession, I charge you to keep the commandment without spot or blame until the manifestation of our Lord Jesus Christ, which he will bring about at the right time. He is the blessed and only Sovereign, the King of kings and Lord of lords. It is he alone who has immortality and dwells in unapproachable light, whom no human being has ever seen or can see; to him be honour and eternal dominion. Amen.

Gospel: Luke 16: 19-31

Jesus told this parable to those among the Pharisees who loved money: "There was a rich man who was dressed in purple and fine linen and who feasted sumptuously every day. And at his gate lay a poor man named Lazarus, covered with sores, who longed to satisfy his hunger with what fell from the rich man's table; even the dogs would come and lick his sores. The poor man died and was carried away by the Angels to be with Abraham. The rich man also died and was buried. In Hades, where he was being tormented, he looked up and saw Abraham far away with Lazarus by his side. He called out, 'Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus to dip the tip of his finger in water and cool my tongue; for I am in agony in these flames.' But Abraham said, 'Child, remember that during your lifetime you received your good things, and Lazarus in like manner evil things; but now he is comforted here, and you are in

Besides all this, between you and us a great chasm has been fixed, so that those who might want to pass from here to you cannot do so, and no one can cross from there to us.' The man who had been rich said, 'Then, father, I beg you to send Lazarus to my father's house for I have five brothers - that he may warn them, so that they will not also come into this place of torment.' Abraham replied, 'They have Moses and the Prophets; they should listen to them.' He said, 'No, father Abraham; but if someone goes to them from the dead, they will repent.' Abraham said to him, 'If they do not listen to Moses and the Prophets, neither will they be convinced even if someone rises from the dead."
