Reflection from Fr Cao for the Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

The readings of this Sunday remind us that God's choice and purpose for us as his disciples is not a product of chance, but a deliberate one.

St Ignatius of Loyola, in the First Principle and Foundation – the very first meditation prayer in the 30-day Spiritual Exercises, goes further to remind the retreatant about his/her own purpose in life:

Human beings are created to praise, reverence, and serve God our Lord, and by this means to save their souls. And other things on the face of the earth are created for them and may help them in procuring the end for which they created. From this, it follows that we are to use these things as much as they help us to the end, and we ought to rid ourselves of things which hinder us.

In the first reading, God chose a poor farmer Amos to be the prophet among other prophets who were corrupt and misused God's created things. These prophets did not deliver justice or speak the truth. Although there was opposition and challenge, Amos fulfilled God's purpose. Amos was not tainted by the corruption and materialism of his time.

In the second reading, St Paul writes to the Ephesians saying that God chose us in Christ "to be holy, and spotless, and to live through love in his presence.... that we should become his adopted sons and daughters." We are chosen "for the praise of the glory of his grace," and in the end, "we have redemption . . . [and] the forgiveness of our sins" in Christ. Therefore we know how to act when time has run its course to the end.

The Gospel highlights Jesus' choice and his purpose for his disciples. Jesus called his disciples and strengthened their faith through his teachings and miracles. He further instructed them on how to go about their mission. He knew the power and influence of materialism and worldly honour. He knew that any soul trapped by these things will lose focus on his mission. In other words, Jesus wanted to remind them that all created things were for their use if they helped to fulfill their purpose.

Disciples particularly must take nothing for the journey "except a staff". This means that we must bring something of ourselves to the people we meet in the world – our own opinions, our own view of the world – but this must not be something for ourselves and against others.

Furthermore, disciples must have "nothing extra"; nothing they can claim as their own, nothing that they can draw on to demand a special sacrifice from themselves; nothing they can store for the next day in case things got rough. They must go as they are with no special requirements, nothing that can be put in place for their personal source of sustenance; and nothing extra to keep for the future when things may be different.

Obeying Christ's instruction therefore is a sure means of fulfilling God's purpose for choosing us as his disciples. At the same time, neglecting Christ's instruction is the easiest way of losing focus. So, we must continually remind ourselves that God chose us for a purpose, and we must strive to achieve it.

Second Reading: Ephesians 1: 3-14

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ. who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, just as he chose us in Christ before the foundation of the world to be holy and blameless before him in love. He destined us for adoption to sonship as his own through Jesus Christ, according to the good pleasure of his will, to the praise of his glorious grace that he freely bestowed on us in the Beloved. In Christ we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace that he lavished on us. With all wisdom and insight God has made known to us the mystery of his will, according to his good pleasure that he set forth in Christ, as a plan for the fullness of time, to gather up all things in Christ, things in heaven and things on earth. In Christ we have also obtained an inheritance having been destined according to the purpose of him who accomplishes all things according to his counsel and will, so that we, who were the first to set our hope on Christ, might live for the praise of his glory. In him you also, when you had heard the word of truth, the Gospel of your salvation, and had believed in him, were marked with the seal of the promised Holy Spirit. This is the pledge of our inheritance towards redemption as God's own people, to the praise of his glory.

Gospel: Mark 6: 7-13

Jesus called the twelve and began to send them out two by two, and gave them authority over the unclean spirits. He ordered them to take nothing for their journey except a staff; no bread, no bag, no money in their belts; but to wear sandals and not to put on two tunics. Jesus said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave the place. If any place will not welcome you and they refuse to hear you, as you leave, shake off the dust that is on your feet as a testimony against them." So the twelve went out and proclaimed that all should repent. They cast out many demons, and anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.

Prayer after Communion:

Having consumed these gifts, we pray, O Lord, that, by our participation in this mystery, its saving effects upon us may grow. Through Christ our Lord.
