Reflection from the Parish Priest for 5th Sunday of Easter

Today's Gospel is taken from middle of the Last Supper discourse in the Gospel of St John 15. Jesus speaks about his relationship to his disciples as of the vine and branches. He affirms that his relationship with them will not end after his death. He will remain with them always. This unity between Jesus and his disciples is the basis for their ability to continue doing the work that he began.

It's consoling to hear Jesus insists his disciples and each one of us remain in him: "Remain in me, as I in you. . ." so to bear fruit in plenty, and "If you remain in me and my words remain in you, you may ask what you will and you shall get it." What does it means "remain in me"?

In "Expository Thoughts on the Gospels: St. John" J.C. Ryle explains, "To abide in Christ means to keep up a habit of constant close communion with Him – to be always leaning on Him, resting on Him, pouring out our hearts to Him, and using Him as our Fountain of life and strength, as our chief Companion and best friend."

For me, remaining in Christ is a process, constantly moving forward. It has a continual, hour-by-hour nature to it, a constant looking to Jesus through the Scriptures with open heart in order to let his words abide in us and make a home in us. God reveals Himself to us through the Word. So, spending much time in His word, asking the Holy Spirit to reveal more of Christ to us, our relationship with Christ would grow closer. J.C. Ryle also says: "To have His words abiding in us, is to keep His sayings and precepts continually before our memories and minds, and to make them the guide of our actions and the rule of our daily conduct and behavior."

Remaining in Christ is a lifelong relationship with Him that grows more intimate over time. Just as marriage is a lifelong relationship where both partners should grow closer to one another over the years, so it should be with Christ. But as those who have been married for a very long time know, growing closer isn't automatic. It requires purposefully spending time together; keeping on working through issues that come up; communicating with each other; enjoying each other's presence. If this does not happen, it's easy to drift apart. The same is true of our abiding in Christ. We can't put our relationship to Christ on autopilot. If we are not growing closer to Christ, we are backsliding from fellowship with Him.

Remaining in Christ also means having a new legal standing and a new relational orientation. We don't only want to be made right with God, we want to be with God. We are new creations in Christ, freed from sin and worldly pursuits to remain in Him. He gives us what we need to pursue this by giving us Himself.

King David once said: "Earnestly I seek you; my soul thirsts for you!" May the Holy Spirit spark in us a desire to be in more intimate relationship Christ. May we yearn with holy urgency to know the depths and riches of the love of Christ, grasped through abiding in Him. Amen Fr Nguyen Van (ao SJ

SCRIPTURE READINGS - YEAR B

Fifth Sunday of Easter

ET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD



Collect:

Almighty ever-living God, constantly accomplish the Paschal Mystery within us, that those you were pleased to make new in Holy Baptism may, under your protective care, bear much fruit and come to the joys of life eternal. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. Amen.

First Reading: Acts 9: 26-31

When Saul had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took him, brought him to the Apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus Saul had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus.

So Saul went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. He spoke and argued with the Hellenists; but they were attempting to kill him. When the believers learned it, they brought Saul down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus.

Meanwhile the Church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers.

Responsorial psalm: Ps 21: 26-28, 30-32 I will praise you, Lord, in the assembly of your people.

My vows I will pay before those who fear him. The poor shall eat and be satisfied; those who seek him shall praise the Lord. May your hearts live forever. R.

All the ends of the earth shall remember and turn to the Lord; and all the families of the nations shall worship before him. To him, indeed, shall all who sleep in the earth bow down; before him shall bow all who go down to the dust. R.

I shall live for him.

Posterity will serve him; future generation will be told about the Lord, and proclaim his deliverance to a people yet unborn, saying that he has done it. R.

Second Reading: 1 John 3:18-24

Little children, let us love, not in word and speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and God knows everything.

Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him.

And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. Whoever obeys his commandments abides in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia!

Live in me and let me live in you, says the Lord; my branches bear much fruit.

Alleluia!

Gospel: John 15: 1-8

Jesus said to his disciples: "I am the true vine, and my Father is the vinegrower. He removes every branch in me that bears no fruit. Every branch that bears fruit he prunes to make it bear more fruit. You have already been cleansed by the word that I have spoken to you.

"Abide in me as I abide in you. Just as the branch cannot bear fruit by itself unless it abides in the vine, neither can you unless you abide in me. I am the vine, you are the branches. Whoever abides in me and I in them bears much fruit, because apart from me you can do nothing.

"Whoever does not abide in me is thrown away like a branch and withers; such branches are gathered, thrown into the fire, and burned.

"If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask for whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. My father is glorified by this, that you bear much fruit and become my disciples."

Prayer after Communion:

Graciously be present to your people, we pray, O Lord, and lead those you have imbued with heavenly mysteries to pass from former ways to newness of life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.





Autumn Holiday Program


