Reflection from Fr Renato for the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

"Jesus story of the Pharisee and the tax collector in the Temple."

In our first reading from the Book of Sirach, we read: "The prayer of the humble reaches the clouds.

At the end of today's Gospel from Luke, Jesus concludes his story about the two men who went to the Temple to pray by saying, "For all who exalt themselves will be humbled, but all who humble themselves will be exalted."

Jesus introduces his story "to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous and regarded others with contempt." Jesus knew that some of the Pharisees—the religious leaders—did not like the tax collectors because they saw them as sinners and collaborators with the Roman occupiers.

Both men came to talk with God — the God of Jesus, his Father. The Pharisee relates to God from his heart, saying arrogantly, "I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector." Then he goes on to boast about his religious observances: "I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.'

"Humility is not thinking less of yourself; it's thinking of yourself less." — C. S. Lewis

This quality was missing in the prayer of the Pharisee. His prayer was that of a self-centréd person. There was real effort and a commitment to holiness within his tradition, but his virtues made him forget that he remained weak and sinful, like other people. His sense of precise holiness took the place of true prayer. He went so far as to despise others while giving thanks for his own merits. By this attitude, he undermined his other virtues.

Pride is like a worm, destroying the apple at its core. Indeed, it turned him from speaking to God to talking about himself. His prayer died.

The tax collector, a sinner, prayed from the heart. While beating his breast, he said, "God, be merciful to me, a sinner." Before God, the tax collector expressed his need in a humble way and sought what God is — merciful.

Genuine humility is simply recognizing the essential truth about ourselves. It is honest self-appraisal in God's presence, with no pretences, masks, or poses. In the presence of the all-holy, all-powerful God, each of us knows ourselves as weak, imperfect, and indeed sinful — and with this, we recognize our need for

There is no bribe we can offer to blot out our guilt. There is no pressure we can exert (as we might among ourselves) to gain credit we do not deserve. Our best recourse is a humble spirit; this attitude will draw down on us divine mercy and

The tax collector felt this need for complete honesty as he stood in the Temple of God. "Lord, be merciful," he said — and went home with his sins forgiven and with relief in his heart.

Let us ponder the two ways of knowing God and knowing ourselves as we ask: What is my way — the way of the Pharisee or the way of the tax collector? "Pride makes ús artificial and humility makes us real." — Thomas Merton The virtue of humility: "Humility is in fact nothing other than the love of God; but to call this love 'humility' is to pinpoint especially the quality of other-directness in love — love as handing oneself over in trust, letting God be the Lord of one's being."

As the tax collector did — letting God "be the Lord of his being" — mercy. Humility is a virtue rooted in the truth of who we are and in the giftedness of our lives. Mother Mary models the meaning of humility through her absolute dependence on God and trust in God's fidelity.

"And what does the Lord require of you? To act justly and to love mercy and to walk humbly with your God." — Micah 6:8

The prayer of the humble pierces the clouds, and it will not rest until it reaches its goal; it will not desist until the Most High responds and does justice for the righteous, and executes judgment. Indeed, the Lord will not delay.

Responsorial Psalm - 33: 2-3, 17-19, 23 R. The Lord hears the cry of the poor.

II will bless the Lord at all times; his praise shall continually be in my mouth. My soul makes its boast in the Lord; let the humble hear and be glad. R.

The face of the Lord is against evildoers, to cut off the remembrance of them from the earth. When the righteous cry for help, the Lord hears, and rescues them from all their troubles. R.

The Lord is near to the brokenhearted, and saves the crushed in spirit. The Lord redeems the life of his servants; none of those who take refuge in him will be condemned. R.

Beloved: I am already being poured out as a libation, and the time of my departure has come. I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith. Jesus told this parable to some who trusted in themselves that they were righteous, and regarded others with contempt: "Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. The Pharisee, standing by himself, was praying thus, 'God, I thank you that I am not like other people: thieves, rogues, adulterers, or even like this tax collector. I fast twice a week; I give a tenth of all my income.' But the tax collector, standing far off, would not even look up to heaven, but was beating his breast and saying, 'God, be merciful to me, a sinner!' I tell you, this man went down to his home justified rather than the other; for whoever exalts himself will be humbled, but whoever humbles himself will be exalted.'

May your Sacraments, O Lord, we pray, perfect in us what lies within them, that what we now celebrate in signs we may one day possess in truth. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
