REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST FOR THE SOLEMNITY OF THE Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

Holy Thursday is really the commemoration of the institution of the Eucharist, but it tends to be overshadowed by the death of Jesus on Good Friday and we loose the focus that should be present. It is therefore a great insight of the Church to have this feast of Corpus Christi as a separate feast now.

In our first reading from Moses' sermon to the Israelites, he makes clear how the long years in the desert had been a time of testing. In the desert there are no natural sources of food and water and the people had to rely upon the provisions provided by God - water from the Rock and manna sent from heaven. In this situation they came to know that God is necessary for protection and life.

But like the Israelites, we too are a forgetful people when times change and the essentials of life are more easily available. We too need to be reminded of the God who provides for us both in the desert experiences, and in the abundance of the 'Promised Land' flowing with milk and honey!



The Eucharist is our Christian symbol of God's providence to sustain and nourish us always. However, it goes well beyond the water and manna of the desert, which was to sustain the Israelites on their journey through the desert. The new Bread from heaven given by Jesus will be the 'flesh for the life of the world'. This is not just for the journey through a wilderness, nor just the journey of our life, but a divine gift for eternal life. It is to sustain the life of the world, and to bring us into communion - a common bond with each other and with Christ around a shared experience of the Eucharistic table. It is a sadness therefore when the Eucharistic table is used as a means of separating some from this bond of a community of mercy, love and community support.

CORPUS CHRISTI SUNDAY

LET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD



FIRST READING: Deuteronomy 8:2-3, 148-16A

Moses spoke to the people: "Remember the long way that the Lord your God has led you these forty years in the wilderness, in order to humble you, testing you to know what was in your heart, whether or not you would keep his commandments."

He humbled you by letting you hunger, then by feeding you with manna, with which neither you nor your ancestors were acquainted, in order to make you understand that man does not live by bread alone, but by every word that comes from the mouth of the Lord.

Do not exalt yourself, forgetting the Lord your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery, who led you through the great and terrible wilderness, an arid wasteland with poisonous snakes and scorpions. He made water flow for you from flint rock, and fed you in the wilderness with manna that your ancestors did not know, to humble you and to test you, and in the end to do you good."

<u>RESPONSORIAL PSALM</u>: Ps 147: 12-13, 14-15, 19-20 (R.12) R: Praise the Lord. Jerusalem.

Praise the Lord, O Jerusalem! Praise your God, O Zion! For he strengthens the bars of your gates; he blesses your children within you. R.

He grants peace within your borders; he fills you with the finest of wheat. He sends out his command to the earth; his word runs swiftly. R.

He declares his word to Jacob, his statutes and ordinances to Israel. He has not dealt thus with any nation; they do not know his ordinances. R.

SECOND READING: 1 Corinthians 10:16-17

Brothers and sisters: The cup of blessing that we bless, is it not a sharing in the Blood of Christ? The bread that we break, is it not a sharing in the Body of Christ? Because there is one bread, we wo are many are one body, for we all partake of the one bread.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION:

Alleluia, alleluia!

I am the living bread that came down from heaven, says the Lord; whoever eats of this bread will live forever.

Alleluia!

GOSPEL: John 6:51-58

Jesus said to his people: "I am the living bread that came down from heaven. Whoever eats of this bread will liv forever; and the bread that I will give for the life of the world is my flesh."

The people then disputed among themselves, saying, "How can this man give us his flesh to eat?" So Jesus said to them, "Very truly, I tell you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.

"Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise them up on the last day; for my flesh is true food and my blood is true drink. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me, and I in them.

Just as the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so whoever eats me will live because of me.

This is the bread that came down from heaven, not like that which your ancestors ate, and they died. But the one who eats this bread will live forever. "Jesus said these things while he was teaching in the synagogue at Capernaum.


