Reflection from Fr Cao for

Second Sunday of Easter (Divine Mercy Sunday)

Many years ago, I visited a friend's family. Their little boy played around and from time to time looked at a stove. It's been turned off, but it's still quite hot. His mother repeatedly told him that it's "Hot." I think it didn't mean much to him. It's just a word; a sound his mother makes when she does not want him to touch the oven. Suddenly we heard him cry in distress. We rushed to him and saw he was trying to rub away and shake his hand like throwing away the sharp burning pain. He clearly and unmistakably said, "Hot!"

We knew that for this little boy, the word "Hot" is no longer just a word, but an experience. The warning not to touch the hot stove no longer needed to be verbalized and repeated. It had become internalized and remembered.

That's not just a characteristic of the child, but of most of us. Not many of us accept someone else's reasoning very easily. We are quite capable of doing our own thinking and testing.

Parents are often confounded by this problem, especially with maturing children. The children seem to have this desire to try things for themselves, rather than depend on the word or experience of the parents.

I have always felt close to Thomas in today's Gospel. His fault was what we, who live in a scientific age, would call "virtue." He needed evidence he could test for himself. We see him move impressively from disbelief to belief.

Jesus appeared and offered Thomas the proof he was asking for. "Put your finger in My wounds and your hand in My side." The Gospel does not say Thomas did this. In fact, it is implied that he didn't. Instead, Thomas says, "My Lord and my God." He is the first person who acclaimed Jesus is "Lord" and "God".

Living in this modern age, we do not see the risen Christ face-to-face. We hear and read the word. We also learn from the Church's doctrines and teachings. However, until we have some personal experiences, they are just concepts like the word "hot" to a little child. The Risen Christ is not like the hot stove that we can touch but He is present in the word and in the broken bread. He is present where He promised, where two or three are gathered in His name. If you love Him, He told you that He and His Father will make Their home with you.

Our faith is tested, yet we can still exclaim, "My Lord and my God." It's no wonder Jesus has said, "Blessed are those who have not seen, yet still believe." However, faith alone is not enough. St. James once said, "What does it profit you to say you have faith, but not works? Can faith alone save you?" So, in our First Reading from Acts of the Apostles, many owned lands or houses. They sold them and share the proceeds among the needy. This is indeed a big challenge for us today. That's what Pope Francis has called us to do.

Following the example of the Apostles and early Christians, let us in bear witness in words and actions to the resurrection of Christ. Let us also give thanks to God who considers us worthy of sharing in the power of the risen Lord.

All who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need. Day by day, as they spent much time together in the temple, they broke bread in various houses and ate their food with glad and generous hearts, praising God and having the goodwill of all the people. And day by day the Lord added to their number those who were being saved.

Second Reading: Revelations 1: 9-13, 17-19
Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ!
By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead: a birth into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you, who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time. In this you rejoice, even if now for a little while you have had to suffer various trials, so that the genuineness of your faith -being more precious than gold that, though perishable, is tested by fire- be found to result in praise and glory and honour when Jesus Christ is revealed. Although you have not seen him, you love him; and even though you do not see him now, you believe in him and rejoice with an indescribable

and glorious joy, for you are receiving the outcome of your

faith, the salvation of your souls.

Alleluia, alleluia!

You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy those who have not seen me, but still believe! Alleluia!

Gospel: John 20: 19-31

It was evening on the day Jesus rose from the dead, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear of the Jews. Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." After he said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples rejoiced when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, so I send you.' When he had said this, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven them; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." But Thomas, who was called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe." After eight days his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut, Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!" Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe.' Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Prayer After Communion:

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that our reception of this paschal Sacrament may have a continuing effect. in our minds and hearts. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.


