Reflection from Fr Renato for the

Feast of the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph

This is the name of our Church, the name of our community that we celebrate on this Feast of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph, celebrated on the Sunday after Christmas. It seeks to portray the Holy Family of Nazareth as the "true model of life," from which our families and our community can draw inspiration and know where to find help and comfort. Holy Family Emerton is proudly one of the most culturally diverse and vibrant Catholic communities within the Diocese of Parramatta, located in the heart of Sydney and Mt Druitt.

Our parish vision is that Holy Family Emerton is a welcoming community, on a journey toward personal encounter with Jesus, called to unity and sharing the joy of the Gospel. What does today's Gospel say to us about the Holy Family that had to flee their home and country to live and survive as refugees in Egypt? The experience of the family of Nazareth cannot but make us think of the many families today who are also "in movement"—certainly those families forced to leave their homes and their own land in search of peace, serenity, and work, but also those families who live with the apprehension and anxiety of not making ends meet, of unstable marital situations, and the fear of illness.

In the family of Nazareth, our families, as well as the human family, can learn to allow ourselves to be guided by God's powerful hand. If it is true, on the one hand, that in many situations people feel like "refugees," "strangers in their own homes," or even in the heart of a loved one, it is also true that every obstacle and every difficulty can be transformed into an opportunity to "depart," an opportunity for a "journey toward conversion," which alone can lead to serenity, peace, and stability. As a welcoming community at Emerton, one with our First Nations people, we are family for one another, guided by God's powerful hand through his Son, Jesus, and the Holy Spirit, in communion with Mary and Joseph—on a journey where we respect and honour all who come to be part of the community, unified in the Word of God, serving with love and joy.

Living the Gospel of the family is what we bring to our Church community. It is not easy. Yet in the Gospel, we find the way to live a beautiful life on the personal and familial level—a way that is certainly challenging, but attractive and all-embracing. It is a way that still deserves to be trusted and undertaken, after the example and through the intercession of the Holy Family of Nazareth itself. The social family virtues of our Holy Family Church—harmony, respect, compassion, service, justice, peace, forgiveness, reconciliation, and mercy—are lived here. Yes, Emerton Holy Family stands as one with all in our country and world, brothers and sisters rooted in the life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph.

Feast of the Holy Family

LET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD

**Collect:**

O God, who were pleased to give us the shining example of the Holy Family, graciously grant that we may imitate them in practicing the virtues of family life and in the bonds of charity, and so, in the joy of your house, delight one day in eternal rewards. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever Amen.

First Reading: Sirach 3: 2-6, 12-14

The Lord honours a father above his children, and he confirms a mother's rights over her sons. Whoever honours their father atones for sins and gains preservation from them; when they pray, they will be heard. Whoever respects their mother is like one who lays up treasure. The person who honours their father will have joy in their own children, and when they pray they will be heard. Whoever respects their father will have a long life, and whoever honours their mother obeys the Lord. My child, help your father in his old age, and do not grieve him as long as he lives. Even if his mind fails, be patient with him; because you have all your faculties, do not despise him all the days of his life. For kindness to your father will not be forgotten, and will be credited to you against your sins— a house raised in justice for you.

Second Reading: Colossians 3: 12-21

Brothers and sisters: As God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another and, if anyone has a complaint against another, forgive each other; just as the Lord has forgiven you, so you also must forgive. Above all, clothe yourselves with love, which binds everything together in perfect harmony. And let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, to which indeed you were called in the one body. And be thankful. Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly; teach and admonish one another in all wisdom; and with gratitude in your hearts sing Psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs to God. Gospel: Matthew 2: 13-15, 19-23

After the wise men had left, an Angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and flee to Egypt, and remain there until I tell you; for Herod is about to search for the child, to destroy him." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother by night, and went to Egypt, and remained there until the death of Herod. This was to fulfill what had been spoken by the Lord through the Prophet, "Out of Egypt I have called my son." When Herod died, an Angel of the Lord suddenly appeared in a dream to Joseph in Egypt and said, "Get up, take the child and his mother, and go to the land of Israel, for those who were seeking the child's life are dead." Then Joseph got up, took the child and his mother, and went to the land of Israel. But when he heard that Archelaus was ruling over Judea in place of his father Herod, he was afraid to go there. And after being warned in a dream, he went away to the district of Galilee. There he made his home in a town called Nazareth, so that what had been spoken through the Prophets might be fulfilled, "He will be called a Nazorean."

Prayer After Communion:

Bring those you refresh with this heavenly Sacrament, most merciful Father, to imitate constantly the example of the Holy Family, so that, after the trials of this world, we may share their company for ever. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.

Bishop Vincent's Christmas Message 2025

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,
Peace be with you this Christmas 2025!

Christmas is about birth, new beginnings and regeneration and the wonder of newborn life. Mary, the Mother of God, yet also a young pregnant woman, was probably afraid, suffering, in a strange place. The no-doubt-anxious Joseph, hovering around, maybe running off to get clean cloths as the birth approached. The baby boy, born in blood and tears and happiness as all babies are, time without end.

And then the explosion of joy at this beginning - angels in the sky, a beacon star, kneeling shepherds and later, grave Magi bringing royal gifts.

Christmas is all this – the joy, the pain, the fear, the expectation, the utter humanity of birth – the everyday miracle and an even greater miracle. God has become one of us and now dwells amongst us forever!

However, Christmas does not just console us with the proclamation of the Emmanuel -God-dwelling-among-us. It also challenges us to act to transform our world. God comes among us not in a parade of power and glory. Rather he chooses to immerse himself fully with our human condition, embracing the trials and tribulations of life. Therefore, reclaiming the Christmas spirit means none other than to imitate God's radical solidarity even at the risk of jeopardising our own status and privilege.

Let's never forget that our God, the maker of all things visible and invisible, was reduced to the most vulnerable of creatures; another little Middle Eastern boy caught up in homelessness, poverty and a cruel cycle of violence. Christmas then, above all, is the special time when we remember our God-given duty to transform the world and our grave responsibility to become peacemakers.

The very first words of our new Holy Father Pope Leo XIV, as Pope, are worth recalling:

Peace be with all of you! Dearest brothers and sisters, this is the first greeting of the Risen Christ, the good shepherd who gave his life for God's flock. I, too, would like this greeting of peace to enter your hearts, to reach your families, and all people, wherever they are, all of the people, all over the earth...This is the peace of the Risen Christ, an unarmed peace and a disarming peace, humble and persevering. It comes from God, God who loves us all unconditionally.

Yes, our violent chaotic planet desperately needs this peace of Christ! Daily our hearts continue to break, when we see the violence especially to children, in places like Gaza, Ukraine and Myanmar.

We cannot just watch all this suffering in front of our eyes passively. We must act then as disciples of Jesus of Nazareth, in the spirit of the Beatitudes, to bring about real change. Together as the Body of Christ, we can make a difference.

My prayer, therefore, is that each of you will feel God's closeness and become instruments of peace in the New Year ahead.

With Pope Leo and St Francis of Assisi, in this holy season of goodwill and peace, we pray:

Lord, make me an instrument of your peace.
