Reflection from Sr Carlene for the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Luke 18: 1-8 "PRAY ALWAYS and STAY STRONG IN THE FAITH"

Today we pray together the psalm response: "Our help is in the name of the Lord". Do we really mean it? If so, what do we mean by it?

Moving on to the Gospel (Lk 18: 1-8) we have a timely reminder in the opening words; "Jesus told the disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart". The ensuing story about the persistent widow and the unjust judge is then followed by those arresting questions and a pertinent instruction from Jesus.

As with most parables, we have some of our values and perceptions turned upside down. The widow in the story wanted justice. She had no husband or family to support and defend her, and no benefits of social security payments yet she <u>never gave up</u>. This fiesty woman pestered the self-centred judge so incessantly that he ended up doing the right thing for the wrong reason. It was in his best interests not just in the sense of getting her off his back, but also in moving him a tiny step toward the possibility of understanding the value of justice and coming to appreciate it.

At this point we are asked "to notice what the unjust judge has to say" and we are reassured that God will see justice done to his chosen... and done speedily." God is not like a heartless, unjust judge; God welcomes us as God's own children.

We are called to be constantly aware of our relationship with God and to persist in our practice of faith. God knows our hearts and thoughts, our wants and needs. God hears our prayers. The difficulty lies with us; so often we don't know our own needs. We pray then not to change God's mind but to change ourselves so that we can see more clearly what it is that God wants from us.

First Reading: Exodus 17: 8-13

Amalek came and fought with Israel at Rephidim. Moses said to Joshua "Choose some men for us and go out, fight with Amalek. Tomorrow I will stand on the top of the hill with the staff of God in my hand." So Joshua did as Moses told him, and fought with Amalek, while Moses, Aaron, and Hur went up to the top of the hill. Whenever Moses held up his hands, Israel prevailed; and whenever he lowered his hands, Amalek prevailed. But Moses' hands grew weary; so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it. Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side; so his hands were steady until the sun set. And Joshua defeated Amalek and his people with the sword.

Beloved: Continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that the one who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching.

Gospel: Luke 18: 1-8

Jesus told the disciples a parable about their need to pray always and not to lose heart. He said, "In a certain city there was a judge who neither feared God nor had respect for any human being. In that city there was a widow who kept coming to him and saying, 'Grant me justice against my opponent.' For a while the judge refused; but later he said to himself, 'Though I have no fear of God and no respect for any human being, yet because this widow keeps bothering me, I will grant her justice, so that she may not wear me out by continually coming." And the Lord said, "Listen to what the unjust judge says. Will not God grant justice to his chosen ones who cry to him day and night? Will he delay long in helping them? I tell you, God will quickly grant justice to them. And yet, when the Son of Man comes, will he find faith on earth?"

Grant, O Lord, we pray, that, benefiting from participation in heavenly things, we may be helped by what you give in this present age and prepared for the gifts that are eternal. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
