REFLECTION FROM THE PARISH PRIEST FOR THE Second Sunday of Lent

Our first reading from Genesis gives Abram a new start. Abram was called out of his family of origin because God had a plan for him, not because he had already performed some noteworthy work. Paul too is very clear that the reason for our salvation is not because of any of our works but because of the grace of God. The three Apostles did nothing to warrant the witnessing of the transfiguration, and even failed to understand its significance, wanting to stay there in tents. What alone in required is an openness to receive the blessing that God wants to bestow.

Pope Francis, in his message for this Lenten season, talks also about the privilege of such special moments with God, but just as importantly is to find special moments away from the mountain, in the ordinary times of our lives. This is where the art of listening deeply to God is important, in prayer, in reading Scripture and responding with acts of charity.

The synodal coming together is a powerful tool for finding and sharing God's graces with each other. Abram,

When the disciples heard this, they fell to the ground and were overcome by fear. But Jesus came and touched them, saying, "Get up and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, they saw no one except Jesus himself alone.

Tereesa is a Gamilaroi woman from Western Sydney who struggled with homelessness while raising her four children. At just 16 years old, she had to leave school after falling pregnant with her first child. A single mother struggling with homelessness, Tereesa's only concern was finding stability for her children.

Seeking a better future for her family, Tereesa joined Baabayn Aboriginal

Corporation's Young Mums and Bubs Group, supported by Caritas Australia. Baabayn helped Tereesa access housing and psychological support. Today, Tereesa is studying a certificate in Community Services so that she can strengthen her skills and give back to her community.

Tereesa now works at Baabayn, providing support to young mothers and mentoring the next generation of young people.

MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS **FOR LENT 2023**

Lenten Penance and the Synodal Journey

"Lenten penance is a commitment, sustained by grace, to overcoming our lack of faith and our resistance to following Jesus on the way of the cross. This is precisely what Peter and the other disciples needed to do. To deepen our knowledge of the Master, to fully understand and embrace the mystery of his salvation, accomplished in total self-giving inspired by love, we must allow ourselves to be taken aside by him and to detach ourselves from mediocrity and vanity. We need to set out on the journey, an uphill path that, like a mountain trek, requires effort, sacrifice and concentration. These requisites are also important for the synodal journey to which, as a Church, we are committed to making. We can benefit greatly from reflecting on the relationship between Lenten penance and the synodal experience."

PERSONAL REFLECTION for the WEEK

Each day this week, find space for at least five minutes of stillness to sit alone with God and focus solely on him. You might do this with a candle, an icon, the Scriptures, or even simply by sitting in nature. Try to increase this time by a few minutes each day.

Prayer:

Eternal Father, your Son has promised that you would grant all the graces we ask of you in his name. Trusting in this promise, and in the name of Jesus Christ, we ask of you the following graces:

- ♦ We ask for *wisdom* to know ourselves more deeply, follow more vou more closely and love you truly. Lord, grace us with your wisdom.
- We ask for your divine *light*, which will enable us to see the vanity of all the things of this earth, and see also your infinite greatness and goodness.

Lord, grace us with your light.

◊ We ask for a share in your *love*, so that we can detach ourselves from all creatures, especially ourselves, and love only your holy will.

Lord, grace us with your love.

- Grant us the grace to have *confidence in the merits* of Jesus Christ and in the intercession of his most holy mother, Mary. Lord, grace us with confidence in your merits.
- ◊ We ask for the grace of *perseverance*, knowing that whenever we call on you for assistance, you will answer our calls and come to our aid.

Lord, grace us with perseverance.

♦ Finally, grant us the grace to pray always, O Eternal Father, in the name of Jesus.

Amen.
