Reflection from the Parish Priest for

Divine Mercy Sunday (2nd Sunday of Easter)

The Divine Mercy Sunday was proclaimed by Pope St. John Paull II at the end of the Canonization Mass of St. Faustina Kowalska in 2000. This Sunday's readings refer to God's mercy, the necessity for trusting faith, and our need for the forgiveness of sins.

During Lent, by our acts of penitence and charity, we allow God to utterly clean our sins by the ocean of divine mercy! But it is not our actions that, as Pope St. John Paul II says, "trample down our sins and toss them into the depths of the sea." It is the grace of God, the merciful Father, that causes the effects of sin to be crushed and swept away so that we can live freely and share in the abundance of God's love.

God's love and mercy is shown through the Sacrament of Penance. Pope St. John Paul II says, Confession is not about ourselves and our sins, but about God and his mercy. Confession is the Sacrament of Resurrection, pure mercy.

Recently, Pope Francis invited us to "celebrate and experience" God's love and forgiveness. Jesus showed his disciples, especially Thomas, his wounds. By those wounds we were healed. Like Thomas, we can learn that God has loved us to the end. God has made our wounds his own and borne our weaknesses in his own body. His wounds are open channels between him and us, shedding mercy upon our misery. His wounds are pathways opened for us to receive his tender love and actually "touch" who he is. Let us never doubt his mercy!

God's mercy is also manifested at every Mass, where Jesus offers us his wounded and risen Body. We touch him and he touches our lives. His radiant wounds dispel the darkness we carry within. Like Thomas, we discover God; we realize how close he is to us and we are moved to exclaim, "My Lord and my God!" (Jn 20:28). Everything comes from the grace of receiving mercy. This is the starting-point of our Christian journey. However, if we trust in our own abilities and the efficiency of our structures and projects, we will not go far. Only if we accept the love of God, will we be able to offer something new to the world.

In reality, this is what the disciples did: receiving mercy, they in turn became merciful. The Acts of the Apostles say that "no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common" (4:32). This is not communism, but pure Christianity! It is all the more surprising when we think that these were the same disciples who had earlier argued about prizes and rewards, and about who was the greatest among them (cf. Mt 10:37; Lk 22:24). Now they share everything; they are "of one heart and soul"" (Acts 4:32). They see in others the same mercy that has changed their own lives. They discover that they shared the mission, the forgiveness and the Body of Jesus, and so it seems natural to share their earthly possessions. The text continues: "There was not a needy person among them" (v. 34). Their fears have been dispelled by touching the Lord's wounds. Now they are unafraid to heal the wounds of those in need because they see Jesus there in the wounds of those in need.

May the Light of God's salvation through Christ shine on us and strengthen our faith firmly in Him.

Second Sunday of Easter

LET US HEAR AND RECEIVE THE WORD OF GOD



Collect:

God of everlasting mercy, who in the very recurrence of the paschal feast kindle the faith of the people you have made your own, increase, we pray, the grace you have bestowed, that all may grasp and rightly understand in what font they have been washed, by whose Spirit they have been reborn, by whose Blood they have been redeemed. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God for ever and ever. Amen.

First Reading: Acts 4: 32-35

The whole group of those who believed were of one heart and soul, and no one claimed private ownership of any possessions, but everything they owned was held in common. With great power the Apostles gave their testimony to the resurrection of the Lord Jesus, and great grace was upon them all.

There was not a needy person among them, for as many as owned lands or houses sold them and through the proceeds of what was sold. They laid it at the Apostles' feet, and it was distributed to each as any had need.

Responsorial psalm: Ps 117: 2-4, 15-18, 22-24 Give thanks to the Lord for he is good, his love is everlasting.

Let Israel say, "His steadfast love endures forever." Let the house of Aaron say,

"His steadfast love endures forever."

Let those who fear the Lord say,

"His steadfast love endures forever." R.

The right hand of the Lord is exalted; the right hand of the Lord does valiantly." I shall not die, but I shall live, and recount the deeds of the Lord. The Lord has punished me severely, but he did not give me over to death." R.

The stone that the builders rejected has become the chief cornerstone. This is the Lord's doing; it is marvellous in our eyes. This is the day that the Lord has made; let us rejoice and be glad in it. R.

Second Reading: 1 John 5: 1-6

Beloved: Everyone who believes that Jesus is the Christ has been born of God, and everyone who loves the parent loves the child.

By this we know that we love the children of God, when we love God and obey his commandments. For the love of God is this, that we obey his commandments. And his commandments are not burdensome, for whatever is born of God conquers the world. And this victory that conquers the world, our faith.

Who is it that conquers the world but the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God? This is the one who came by water and blood, Jesus Christ, not with the water only but with the water and the blood. And the Spirit is the one that testifies, for the Spirit is the truth.

You believe in me, Thomas, because you have seen me; happy those who have not seen me, but still believe! **Alleluia!**

Gospel: John 20: 19-31

But Thomas, who was called the Twin, one of the twelve, was not with them when Jesus came. So the other disciples told him, "We have seen the Lord." But he said to them, "Unless I see the mark of the nails in his hands, and put my finger in the mark of the nails and my hand in his side, I will not believe."

After eight days his disciples were again in the house, and Thomas was with them. Although the doors were shut Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you." Then he said to Thomas, "Put your finger here and see my hands. Reach out your hand and put it in my side. Do not doubt but believe." Thomas answered him, "My Lord and my God!"

Jesus said to him, "Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who not seen and yet have come to believe.

Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name.

Prayer after Communion:

Grant, we pray, almighty God, that our reception of this paschal Sacrament may have a continuing effect in our minds and hearts. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
