Reflection from Sr Carlene for the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time in Year C Cost of Discipleship: Luke 14: 25-33

What does it cost us to follow Jesus faithfully throughout life?

This question arises from pondering the implications and lessons gleaned from today's Gospel (Lk 14: 25–33). The evangelist sets the scene: Jesus is "on his way" to Jerusalem and ultimately to crucifixion. accompanied by "great crowds" who have not yet grasped the full meaning of discipleship, Jesus proceeds to enlighten them. Just being acquainted with Him is not equated to following Him totally, wholeheartedly. Hence, Jesus pulls on punches!

Jesus declared that his disciples must "hate" their closest relatives, their own reputations, and their own lives. While the word "hate" seems very harsh, it is an example of Hebrew hyperbole and is more aptly translated as "leave aside". Disciples are expected to give preference to following Jesus and the gospel. They are to "leave aside" whoever and whatever detracts them from their complete allegiance to Him.

The evangelist continues Jesus' teaching by inserting two short parables which emphasise the need to reflect before acting. Would-be disciples are to weigh up the cost and freely choose to follow Jesus though this may incur ridicule or shame, loss of status, and giving up possessoins... all of which happened to Jesus Himself.

Likewise, our call to discipleship involves costs and challenges. Amidst the realities of life we face some rough patches that cause us deep personal suffering. Experiencing our own brokenness, we know and feel the pain endured in living a Gospel way of life that respects the rights of all created beings. Therefore, in all our actions, let us keep our eyes on God and pray:



Lord, teach me to be generous, to serve you as you deserve, to give and not to count the cost, to fight and not to beed the wounds, to toil and not to seek for rest, to labour and not to look for any reward, save that of knowing that I do your holy will.

First Reading: Wisdom 9: 13-18

For who can learn the counsel of God? Or who can discern what the Lord wills? For the reasoning of mortals is worthless, and our designs are likely to fail; for a perishable body weighs down the soul, and this earthly tent burdens the thoughtful mind. We can hardly guess at what is on earth, and what is at hand we find with labour; but who has traced out what is in the heavens? Who has learned your counsel, unless you have given wisdom and sent your holy spirit from on high? And thus the paths of those on earth were set right, and people were taught what pleases you, and were saved by wisdom.

Responsorial Psalm - Ps 89 (90) 3-6, 12-14, 17

R: In every age, O Lord, you have been our refuge.

You turn man back to dust, and say, "Turn back, you children of Adam. For a thousand years in your sight are like yesterday when it is past, or like a watch in the night. R.

You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers. R.

So teach us to count our days that we may gain a wise heart. Turn, O Lord! How long? Have compassion on your servants! R.

Satisfy us in the morning with so that we may rejoice and be glad all our days. Let the favour of the Lord our God be upon us, and prosper for us the work of our hands. R.

Second Reading: Philemon 9-10, 12-17

Beloved: I, Paul, do this as an old man, and now also as a prisoner of Christ Jesus. I am appealing to you for my child, Onesimus, whose father I have become during my imprisonment. I am sending him, that is, my own heart, back to you. I wanted to keep him with me, so that he might be of service to me in your place during my imprisonment for the Gospel; but I preferred to do nothing without your consent, in order that your good deed might be voluntary and not something forced. Perhaps this is the reason he was separated from you for a while, so that you might have him back forever, no longer as a slave but more than a slave, a beloved brother- especially to me but how much more to you, both in the flesh and in the Lord. So if you consider me your partner, welcome him as you would welcome me.

Gospel Acclamation:

Alleluia, alleluia! Let your face shine on your servant, and teach me your laws. Alleluia!

Gospel: Luke 14: 25-33

Large crowds were travelling with Jesus; and he turned and said to them, "Whoever comes to me and does not hate their father and mother, spouse and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even their life itself, cannot be my disciple. Whoever does not carry their cross and follow me cannot be my disciple. For which of you, intending to build a tower, does not first sit down and estimate the cost, to see whether he has enough to complete it? Otherwise, when he has laid a foundation and is not able to finish, all who see it will begin to ridicule him, saying, 'This fellow began to build and was not able to finish.' Or what king, going out to wage war against another king, will not sit down first and consider whether he is able with ten thousand to oppose the one who comes against him with twenty thousand? If he cannot, then, while the other is still far away, he sends a delegation and asks for the terms of peace. So therefore, whoever of you does not give up all their possessions cannot be my disciple."

Prayer After Communion:

Grant that your faithful, O Lord, whom you nourish and endow with life through the food of your Word and heavenly Sacrament, may so benefit from your beloved Son's great gifts that we may merit an eternal share in his life. Through Christ our Lord. Amen.
